## Definitions

- Noun: Person, place, thing, idea or quality
- O **Pronoun**: Takes place of a noun
  - O Can be a subject or an object
- Gerund: A verb used as a noun.
  - O Usually ends in -ing, -ed, -t or -en
  - O Can be a subject or an object
- O Infinitive: Basic verb form start with "to"
- O Subject: The part of the sentence that is doing something or being something
- Object: The part of the sentence that receives the action

## Singular and Plural

- O If the singular form of the noun does not end in -s or -es, add an -s.
- O If the noun ends in -ch, -s, -sh, -ss, -tch, -x and sometimes -z or -zz, add an -es.
- O If the noun ends in -y that followed a consonant, change "y" to "i" and add -es.
- O If the noun ends in -y that followed a vowel, add -s.
- O If the noun ends in -fe or -If, change the ending to -ve and add -s (usually).
- If the noun ends in -o, add -s (usually).
- O Some nouns form plurals using -en.
- There are many exceptions.
